

Drew's artifacts

This horseshoe dates back to the late 19th century. The horseshoe is about 15 centimetres long and 12 centimetre wide. It has rusted quite a bit, but the nail holes are still visible. The thickness of the horseshoe is roughly a centimetre. This is one of the newest horseshoes, the oldest ones dated back to the 17th century.

This nail dates back around 1820 and onward. It is 15 centimetres long and a centimetre thick, it is a cut nail, so it was cut from a sheet of metal. This nail is a lot longer than most nails, which are close to 10 centimetres.

This sardine can opener dates back to 1925. It is 7 centimetres long and half a centimetre thick. It is not nearly as old as the other artifacts. This is one of the more interesting artifacts because I have actually never seen one of these sardine can openers.
