The AC will work under the direction and supervision of the Lead Archaeological Counsellor, Senior Archaeologist and Education Officer:

- a. Prepare for the camp prior to the arrival of the camp participants
- b. Prepare literature and booklets for participants
- c. Give instruction to the camp participants in historical investigation, excavation planning, excavation techniques, artifact analysis, and record keeping
- d. Assist in the supervision of the camp participants' work in archaeological methods and excavation
- e. Participate in the excavation
- f. Interpret the site to visitors

CPIC must be received before commencement of employment.

Employees must supply their own steel toed work boots for the excavation.
